
Please visit the table and take as many invitations as you like to give to friends, family and neighbours!

RSCM Bath Residential Course: Two of our choristers, Annabelle and Tia have enjoyed attending the RSCM residential course in Bath this summer, thanks to the Helen Arnold Memorial fund and a grant from the Educational charity, for which we are extremely grateful. They had a fantastic week, culminating in singing services in Bath Abbey, and both came away with glowing reports.

Bishops Award exam success: Whilst at the Bath course, Tia was able to take her long overdue Bishops Award exam (lack of examiners, examination opportunities in our area and Covid made this impossible until now). I am delighted she passed this exam with a magnificent 'Highly Commended' result. She will be presented with her award in Church this Sunday.

Chorister Leavers Service: We will formally thank Tia and Annabelle for their time as choristers here at St Lawrence at their Leavers Service this Sunday 11th September at 5pm, where we will perform music chosen by the choristers themselves. They have given over 22 years of service between them, and supported the choir in all its activities, including Cathedral visits, Diocesan events, Restoration Appeal Christmas concerts and even narrating the Crib Service! We are extremely grateful for all they have done, and wish them well as they leave for University: Tia will be studying History at Southampton University and Annabelle Medicine at Magdalen College, Oxford.
