WELCOME TO ST LAWRENCE CHURCH, LECHLADE

We come together to worship God, who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As the people of God, we want to worship in spirit and truth, whether in traditional or more contemporary ways. Our prayer is that you know and experience Jesus Christ for yourself, trusting in Him as Lord and Saviour.

LIVE STREAMING – 10am Sunday services, together with a few other special services, are broadcast and recordings will be available for subsequent viewing. People cannot be with us in person for a wide variety of different reasons and this facility is an increasingly important ministry.

CHILDREN – we welcome children and want parents to feel comfortable and safe bringing their families to worship with us. There is a Children's Corner at the back of church with toys and activities. Children's groups (divided up by age) meet most Sundays to have fun and explore the Christian faith together.

TOILETS are currently situated in the Church Cottage, through the gate in the wall on your right-hand side as you leave the church.

PRAYER MINISTRY – if you have a burden which you would like to share with someone, trusted Christians in our prayer ministry team are available to pray with you straight after the 10am service.

REFRESHMENTS – we invite you to join us for refreshments after the 10am service on a Sunday. This time of fellowship is a great opportunity to meet new people and catch up with friends.

FINANCIAL GIVING – giving is an important part of our Christian discipleship, and your gift towards the mission, ministry and upkeep of this church is appreciated and welcomed. You can give cash in the collection plate or use our contactless giving unit. We also encourage planned giving through the Parish Giving Scheme – details of the Scheme and also Gift Aid declaration envelopes for one-off donations are available at the back of church or from our Treasurer.
