## Supporting document to the faculty submission in response to the DAC request dated 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022

The DAC requested that before the June meeting of the Committee, the PCC submits a concise statement explaining how different parts of the church would be used following the reordering, and how many different groups have committed to using them or are expected to use them.

This short paper is in response to this request. It expands on Table 4.2 of the Statement of Need.

Our church is growing. Post-covid, the number of people worshipping in our four services has grown steadily, and we continue to attract new worshippers to our church family, whether the ladies in retirement who recently came to faith and were confirmed, or the young families who have begun to worship with us over the last two years. We see this as fulfilling the diocesan LIFE vision, especially where it calls us to 'nurture everyday disciples' and 'excite young people to explore and grow in faith.'<sup>1</sup> To continue doing this, we need a building that supports our current activities and gives greater scope for new ones. Accordingly, this outline of activities includes those already taking place, and those to which we aspire, but which we cannot properly offer with our current buildings.

Again, with reference to the LIFE vision, we cannot 'encourage new and courageous ways of worshipping...which connect with more people' without a building that is fit for doing things in new ways.<sup>2</sup> A building without proper heating, toilets, accessibility, lighting, or audio-visual facilities cannot 'connect with more people' in the mid-twenty-first century or beyond.

We also seek to take a full part in the life of the South Cotswolds Team, and the Cirencester Deanery. Our facilities would benefit not only our parish, but both these wider groupings, as we are asked to work more closely and interconnectedly across Team and Deanery as part of the new Strategic Plans. We ask the Diocese to back us in doing what the Diocese asks of us.

The layout drawings 1922-27A, 28 and 29 prepared by Chedburn Codd (on the faculty portal) show how the nave can be configured for worship, concerts, meetings, meals and other activities using seating and tables. These arrangements have been tested when the pews were temporarily removed and replaced by chairs for the 2022 Mission, shown in Annex 1.
